Your application must be entered online and requires use of a scanner and the internet, passport-quality photographs, and extensive paperwork. 50,000 diversity visas will be distributed. (In 2012, there were almost 8 million entries for the lottery of 50,000 visas, giving applicants a 1 in 160 chance of receiving a visa.)  IF NO, sorry. You will not receive a visa to immigrate this way.
